#### PERMISSION TO ACCEPT

1. <u>Permission to Accept the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Children's Services Council Grant Program – After School/Out of School (AS/OS) Program Grant</u>

- <u>Agreement/Contract drafted by</u> Children's Services Council of Martin County, Inc., Martin County Parks and Recreation, and County Attorney's Office
- <u>Parties to the Agreement/Contract</u> Children's Services Council of Martin County, Inc. and Martin County Board of County Commissioners
- Purpose of the Agreement/Contract This is a contract for a Grant award of \$407,347. This funding pays for the staff, maintenance, supplies and programming at the Golden Gate Alternative After School (G.A.A.P.) program at Lamar Howard Park in Golden Gate (Stuart), the Jensen After School Experience (J.A.S.E.) program at Langford Park in Jensen Beach, the Residents Empowering All Children's Hope (R.E.A.C.H.) program at New Monrovia Park in New Monrovia (Port Salerno), and the X-Treme Teen Countywide and Summer Program.
- New/Renewal/Modified New (contract is awarded annually)
- <u>Duration</u> October 1, 2025 September 30, 2026
- Benefits to Martin County These programs are essential to the growth and development of Martin County youth. The After School/Out of School (A.S./O.S) programs have been serving our youth since 1994 in various forms. This includes programs and activities for low-income youth and families, such as homework help, tutoring, physical fitness, outdoor recreation, cultural exposure to arts, dance and music, neighborhood special events, as well as providing safe after school care and summer camp.
- <u>Cost to Martin County</u> Grant Match is approximately \$578,372.17, which is currently budgeted for existing full-time equivalent staff, programming, and supplies as well as staff time to administer the grant in the Parks and Recreation operating budget.

## **Alternative Action:**

Programmatic Implication if not approved – If not approved, the after-school programs: GAAP, JASE, REACH, as well as the county-wide teen program will no longer be able to be offered to the community due to lack of funding.

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 <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> – The staff and programs are financially dependent upon these funds. If not approved, the programs will be unable to operate under the current structure.

- 2. <u>Permission to Accept the Mental Health Awareness Training Grant</u> (5H79SM084627-03)
  - Agreement/Contract drafted by US Department of Health and Human Services
  - <u>Parties to the Agreement/Contract</u> US Department of Health and Human Services and Martin County Board of County Commissioners
  - Purpose of the Agreement/Contract Grant award of \$120,000 for Budget Period 3 (Year 4) of the Mental Health Awareness Training Grant 5H79SM084627-03 to promote and conduct Mental Health Awareness Training initiatives throughout Martin County. In total, this grant is anticipated to be four years (December 2022 September 2026).
  - <u>New/Renewal/Modified</u> New (year four of the four-year award)
  - **Duration** September 30, 2025 September 29, 2026
  - Benefits to Martin County Enables the County to expand and support local
    efforts that provide Mental Health Awareness Trainings. This program will allow
    Martin County to educate residents and individuals who work to serve Martin
    County residents regarding their understanding of Mental Health and how to
    better assist and support someone who is experiencing a Mental Health need.
  - Cost to Martin County Staff time to administer the grant.

## **Alternative Action:**

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> Martin County will not be able to conduct a sufficient number of trainings to promote Mental Health Awareness across the county.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> There will be no funding to support these training efforts, causing a reduction in offerings for residents and local business employees.

## 3. Permission to Accept the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) for 2025-2026

- <u>Purpose of the Agreement/Contract</u> To enable St. Lucie County to act as the applicant for CSBG funding and for Martin County to subsequently act as a subcontractor of St. Lucie County's awarded CSBG funds.

- <u>Duration</u> July 1, 2025 June 30, 2026
- Benefits to Martin County Enables Martin County, as a sub-contractor, to receive \$102,547 in CSBG funding to provide services to targeted residents of Martin County.
- Cost to Martin County Staff time to administer the grant.

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> Loss of a staff member Discontinue assisting residents with rental assistance, emergency electric assistance, and utility assistance as a result of staffing reduction, which negatively impacts the county's homeless prevention initiatives.

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• <u>Duration</u> – October 1, 2025 – September 30, 2026

- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u> Enables the County to offset drug testing supply expenses incurred by the Mental Health Court program.
