A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, RELATING TO THE ROAD JURISDICTION TRANSFER AGREEMENT WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR CR-714 (SW MARTIN HIGHWAY), SE INDIAN STREET, SR-732 NW/ NE JENSEN BEACH BOULEVARD), AND SR-732 (NE CAUSEWAY BOULEVARD)

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (Department) refers to roadway corridors taken onto the State Highway System as ON, and roadway corridors taken off of the State Highway System as OFF;

WHEREAS, roadway corridors may have multiple names simultaneously, as assigned by each agency with jurisdictional authority, with "US" referring to roadway corridors under FEDERAL jurisdiction, "SR" referring to roadway corridors under STATE jurisdiction, and "CR" referring to roadway corridors under COUNTY jurisdiction. Roadways without these acronyms are typically LOCAL roadways;

WHEREAS, based on the obligations set forth herein and in consideration of the criteria set forth in Section 335.0415, Florida Statutes, the Department and County are amenable to the following transfers as depicted on the location map attached hereto as Exhibit A:

- CR-714 (SW Martin Highway) and SE Indian Street ON to the State Highway System; and
- SR-732 (NW / NE Jensen Beach Boulevard) and SR-732 (NE Causeway Boulevard) OFF of the State Highway System;

WHEREAS, a Road Jurisdiction Transfer Agreement has been developed to identify the associated physical features and outline the process and timing of the various roadway corridor transfers;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has made the following determinations of fact:

- 1. The Board of County Commissioners agrees with the terms and conditions contained in the Road Jurisdiction Transfer Agreement;
- The Road Jurisdiction Transfer Agreement was considered at a public hearing on May 20, 2025, which was properly advertised by the Department;
- 3. At the public hearing, all interested parties were given an opportunity to be heard; and

4. Although not a land development application, the proposed Road Jurisdiction Transfer Agreement is consistent with the goals, objectives, and policies of the Comprehensive Growth Management Plan of Martin County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

- 1. The Board of County Commissioners hereby acknowledges and incorporates the recitals set forth in this Resolution.
- The Board of County Commissioners hereby authorizes the Chair to execute the Road Jurisdiction Transfer Agreement for CR-714 (SW Martin Highway), SE Indian Street, SR-732 (NW / NE Jensen Beach Boulevard), and SR-732 (NE Causeway Boulevard) on its behalf.
- The Board of County Commissioners hereby delegates the responsibility to take any and all necessary administrative actions that may be desirable or necessary to implement the provisions of the Road Jurisdiction Transfer Agreement to the County Administrator, or designee.


