6469/Joy Puerta	<b>Golden Gate</b> El Camino Bike/Ped Trail	The Golden Gate Community Redevelopment Plan calls for a system of pedestrian and bike trails. This multi-modal, linear park pathway will provide pedestrian and bicycle connections, increase safety, encourage walking and riding, and become a beautiful neighborhood asset utilizing existing county-owned property within the community.	The changes in the project were approved and Giangrande Engineering is finishing the plans.
Jana Cox	<b>Hobe Sound</b> Dixie Highway Stormwater and Streetscape Redesign	The Martin County CRA vision for Hobe Sound includes the renewal of the AIA streetscape from SE Bridge Road to SE Saturn Street. This includes Old Post Office Alley and the connecting side streets. Project elements will include improved drainage and stormwater, beautification, redefined pedestrian spaces and parking. The Hobe Sound Neighborhood Advisory Committee also recommends additional economic development strategies like incentives to attract and retain businesses and commercial development; the provision of stormwater solutions for property redevelopment; and the addition of historic and creative placemaking elements to be significant in supporting the success of the corridor.	The conceptual plans are complete. Planning for the engineering design will continue.
7090/Joy Puerta	<b>Port Salerno</b> Parking Innovations	Increased parking on the East and West sides of the Port Salerno CRA continues to be a priority for the community. CRA staff along with consultants, the NAC and the CRA Board have been working with the community and bringing ideas and concepts for additional parking potential.	FEC Railroad submitted their lease estimate for parking on the west side of the tracks, the NAC recommended against the lease, as did the CRA Board. Staff has been directed to look at parking on the east side of the FEC Railroad.
7090/Joy Puerta	<b>Port Salerno</b> Infrastructure Partnerships	Park Drive Improvements - Sewer installation, road paving, some drainage, tree and light pole removal, enlarging of cement pads and new signage will be completed. Public Works is designing and constructing the project with the CRA funding the Park Drive activities.	The project is at 60% design.
7090/Joy Puerta	<b>Port Salerno</b> Sidewalk Connections	329 linear feet of 6-foot sidewalk connecting the north side of SE Cove Road between SE Grouper Avenue and SE Ebbtide Avenue. This will include 14 silver buttonwood trees. There is currently no sidewalk on this side making it difficult for those students to safely walk to and from Murray Middle School and their neighborhood.	100% plans complete. Waiting on Capital Projects to complete the repaving of Cove Road.
7169/Jordan Pastorius	<b>Rio</b> Stormwater Solutions	Bio-swales are constructed to assist with water treatment, increased water quality and enhanced drainage. They are also a beautiful neighborhood amenity.	Project construction began Monday, January 8, 2024.

Creative Placemaking will continue with the addition of 8 mosaic benches and 8 additional bike racks.</p>	<p>Benches and Bike Racks are complete! We will keep you posted on the plan to more formally celebrate these new amenities in the Rio CRA.</p>
<p><b>7168/Jordan Pastorius</b></p>	<p><b>Old Palm City Palm City Place &amp; Patio</b></p>	<p>The Palm City Place &amp; Patio is a small space west of Mapp Road next to the new Stormwater Treatment area. It is being designed as a passive park area for residents to enjoy. Elements of the Place could include walking trails around the STA, seating, pavilions, public art, informational signs/kiosks, etc.</p>	<p>All fifteen (15) Bismarck palms are installed. Pavers have begun installation. The pavilion is being installed and all furnishings have been delivered (ping pong tables, game tables, cornhole, fountain)</p>
<p><b>3871/Jordan Pastorius</b></p>	<p><b>Old Palm City "Ripple" EcoArt Stormwater</b></p>	<p>Ripple - <i>as a drop of water becomes a river.....</i> is an environmental restoration project in the Old Palm City neighborhood that takes place on four county-owned lots. Staff and residents worked together to plan a series of stormwater interventions, including walking paths, art installations, water quality educational awareness, and treatment technology on water quality issues, etc.</p>	<p>Weather vane have been produced and installed, shelter ceiling panels will be installed by the end of the month. We are planning a March ribbon cutting.</p>
<p><b>6748/Jordan Pastorius</b></p>	<p><b>Old Palm City Charlie Leighton Park</b></p>	<p>Old Palm City Neighborhood Advisory Committee and residents indicated that they felt Charlie Leighton Park was an underutilized asset. The community would like to see some additional amenities that would improve resident use and access and voted to dedicate CRA Trust Funds to explore the possibilities. Additionally, they requested that alternative funding sources be sought.</p>	<p>The Parks Department has renovated the Community Center and constructed an office to house the Palm City Chamber of Commerce. The "new" building is home to the Old Palm City Neighborhood Advisory Committee again.</p>
<p><b>Susan Kores</b></p>	<p><b>CRA Neighborhood Enhancements</b></p>	<p>Each CRA area has its own Community Redevelopment Plan which directs the improvements to be completed in that area. In order to accomplish that vision, it is often necessary to have the ability to construct smaller projects that can substantially add to the quality of life, safety and aesthetics of an area.
