- 1. <u>Permission to Apply for the Florida Department of State, Division of Library and Information Services Annual State Aid to Libraries Grant for 2026</u>
 - Requestor Martin County Library System
 - <u>Granting Agency</u> Florida Department of State, Division of Library and Information Services (State Library)
 - <u>Project Description</u> The State Library annual grant will continue funding a full time Library Specialist position as approved by the Martin County Board of County Commissioners on June 24, 2015. This grant is awarded annually to provide funding for managing and coordinating free library services to Martin County residents.
 - <u>Requested Grant Award</u> \$85,005 (Estimate provided by the State Library. A budget resolution for the final amount will be presented to the Board for approval when the grant is awarded).
 - <u>Budgetary Impact</u> Operating funds for an existing full-time library position.
 - Annual operating costs Staff time to administer the grant.

Alternative Action:

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> Additional funds will not be available to provide additional staffing for public services.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> Additional funds will not be available to provide additional staffing for public services.

- 2. <u>Permission to Apply for the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Water Quality Improvement Grant for Martin County's Septic to Sewer Program</u>
 - Requestor Utilities & Solid Waste Department
 - Granting Agency FDEP
 - <u>Project Description</u> The Martin County Board of County Commissioners has launched a 10-year program to eliminate on-site septic systems, prioritizing projects that impact the Indian River Lagoon and St. Lucie Estuary. This grant proposal aims to reduce nutrient runoff while lowering costs for about 2,000 properties to connect to vacuum or grinder sewer systems. The grants will make the project more affordable and incentivize homeowners to connect to the central sewer system by providing a \$1,000 reduction in connection costs.
 - Requested Grant Award \$2,000,000
 - <u>Budgetary Impact</u> The total estimated cost of the project is \$65,000,000. Utilities previously received grant awards of \$31,000,000 and have reduced estimated infrastructure construction costs to \$34,000,000. A \$1,000,000 grant match to reduce on-site residential connection costs is budgeted in the Utilities and Solid Waste Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).
 - Annual operating costs Staff time to administer the grant.

Alternative Action:

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> Lack of grant funding will impact
 the acceleration of projects to increase environmental protection and increase
 residential cost to connect.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> Utilize CIP budgeted utility fees or seek alternative funding.

 Move that the Board authorize the Utilities and Solid Waste Director or designee to apply for the FDEP Water Quality Improvement Grant program funding and sign other non-monetary documents related to this grant upon review and concurrence of the County Attorney's Office.

- 3. <u>Permission to Accept Funding from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) for Derelict Vessel Removal Funds</u>
 - Agreement/Contract drafted by FIND
 - Parties to the Agreement/Contract FIND and Martin County Board of County Commissioners
 - <u>Purpose of the Agreement/Contract</u> Grant award of \$88,492.50 for reimbursement of removal and destruction of derelict vessels from the Martin County Waterways.
 - <u>New/Renewal/Modified</u> New (contract is awarded annually)
 - **Duration –** Previous twelve months
 - Benefits to Martin County Reduce the County's costs for removing derelict vessels from Martin County waterways by utilizing available grant funding.
 - <u>Cost to Martin County</u> Expense has already occurred; approval of the grant funds will offset 75% of the expended costs associated with seventeen previously removed and destroyed vessels.

Alternative Action:

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> The County will not be reimbursed for the removal.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> Martin County will be responsible for 100% of the removal costs, which have already been incurred.
