


## Purpose

# Scope of Problem- Statewide According to Medical Examiner's Report

Total drug-related deaths increased by 4 percent (494 more).

6,128 opioid-related deaths were reported, which is a 10 percent increase (552 more).

The drugs that caused the most deaths were fentanyl (3,244), followed by cocaine (1,843).

Occurrences of fentanyl increased by 35 percent (952 more) and deaths caused by fentanyl increased by 38 percent (896 more).

Occurrences of fentanyl analogs increased by 35 percent (366 more) and deaths caused by fentanyl analogs increased by 5.5 percent (48 more).


**Fentanyl** – Synthetic opioid analgesic supplied in transdermal patches and also available for oral, nasal, intravenous and spinal administration. Fentanyl is also produced illicitly and currently most fentanyl occurrences represent the ingestion of illicit fentanyl rather than pharmaceutically manufactured fentanyl.

**Fentanyl Analog** – A synthetic opioid structurally similar to fentanyl. Many analogs of fentanyl are pharmacologically more potent than fentanyl. Carfentanil is an analog of fentanyl approved for veterinary use only.

# Newest Federal Data-CDC

There were 93,331 reported deaths from overdoses in 2020, up from 70,980 the year before, marking the largest annual increase in at least 50 years, said officials at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Nearly three-quarters of fatal overdoses were attributed to opioids, an increase from just over 70 percent in 2019 that was largely driven by the powerful synthetic opioid fentanyl. Deaths from cocaine and methamphetamine also continued their years-long rise.



Naloxone is a medication used to block the effects of Opioids. Usually sprayed into the person's nose and works to counter decreased breathing.


