Agenda Item: 25-0167: Access to the Arts

Tori Hill, Administrative Coordinator with MartinArts will offered a brief presentation on the Access to the Arts Program. The program's objective is to enhance arts programming and outreach within underserved communities in Martin County, i.e., those facing economic

challenges, people with physical/intellectual disabilities, veterans, and others. The Committee members and the community had an opportunity to participate by answering a few short survey questions via cards or a QR code.

- M. Capps Are there grants available?
- T. Hill We have already applied for a National Endowment for the Arts grant and there are other opportunities like the State Division of Historic Resources and private donors as well.

Agenda Item: 25-0168, Golden Gate – CRA Architectural Design Standards

Dana Little, Urban Design Director and Jessica Seymour, Principal Program Coordinator of the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council provided a presentation on the updated proposed CRA Architectural Design Standards for all six Martin County CRA areas. This effort has been undertaken to update and codify the design standards for clarity and predictability of use by architects, builders, property owners and staff, and to continue to implement the vision of well-designed communities that celebrate their distinctive identities and contribute to the overall sustainability of Martin County.

- B. Tanzer We need to take off the heights on the matrix of the different styles
- M. Capps Where does the basic duplex fit in?
- J. Seymour A duplex is not an architectural style, it's a building type.
- J. Gonzalez This is not good for affordable housing as it's going to push out investors and the people who live here now. It will also make the building more expensive.
- J. Seymour She explained how certain features on a house, a roof, windows, and doors are standard requirements for a house so whether you rotate the windows to be vertical would not be an increase in the cost.
- J. Seymour went through all of the styles and how they fit historically and currently into the fabric of Golden Gate. S. Kores talked about the incremental changes that we are looking for as far as the CRA vision and how important this effort is. Both emphasized that it provides the flexibility for architects, builders and residents and also works towards the future goals and sustainability of the community.

The NAC decided to go through each style and talk about the pros and cons of each. The Committee voted unanimously to include all except for Classical and Art Deco.
