<u>SECTION 2.</u> Company Profile and Qualifications, Including Operational Experience, Safety Record for High-Speed Rail Passenger Service Train Stations History and Structure:

Brightline Trains Florida LLC ("Brightline") is a higher-speed intercity passenger rail system connecting major populations along one of the largest and most congested travel corridors in the U.S. The approximate 235-mile system currently has six stations located in Downtown Miami, Aventura, Fort Lauderdale, Boca Raton, West Palm Beach and Orlando.

We are the only privately owned and operated passenger train company in the United States. Brightline is primarily owned, indirectly, by funds managed by an affiliate of Fortress Investment Group. Fortress is a global investment manager that oversees more than \$46 billion of assets under management and has a long history of investing across the transportation and infrastructure space. Brightline Florida is headquartered in Miami, Florida. Our Florida team has a presence in each city where we operate, with the largest number of employees based in Miami and Orlando.

We began the initial activities associated with Brightline in 2012 and commenced construction in 2014. We began operations in 2018 with three stations located in Miami, Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach. In December 2022, we opened two additional stations in Aventura and Boca Raton. In September 2023, we commenced long-distance intercity rail service with the opening of our newest station at Orlando International Airport. With the opening of Brightline's Orlando Station, we are now providing daily service between South Florida and Orlando and operating from early morning to late evening.

Brightline has a team of qualified professionals with relevant experience that are well suited to undertake the Project. Key team members include the following individuals:

PATRICK GODDARD, President. Patrick is responsible for all aspects of Brightline, including safety, development, operations and the guest experience. Prior to joining Brightline, Patrick was the president and chief operating officer for Trust Hospitality, an international owner, developer and operator of boutique and luxury hotels, many of which have been entrepreneurial and start-up ventures successfully launched in South Florida. Patrick grew this portfolio from 10 to 40 hotels over six years. Prior to that, he was the president and managing director of Ocean Blue Hospitality, a consultancy firm that specialized in hotel openings and sales, marketing and revenue management for independent hotels. While there, he successfully repositioned and managed many iconic South Florida hospitality venues including the Clevelander Hotel & Bar, the Raleigh Hotel, the Savoy Hotel and the Grand Beach Hotel. Patrick also held management positions with Rosewood Hotels, Loews Hotels in the United States and the Caribbean as well as Hilton Hotels, Jurys Hotels and other independent hotels and restaurants in Europe. Born and educated in Ireland, Patrick has a degree in hospitality management granted by Trinity College Dublin.

JEFF SWIATEK, Chief Financial Officer. Jeff oversees the financial aspects of the development and operations of Brightline. He has more than 25 years of experience in international corporate finance, strategy and business development. Most recently, Jeff spent 15 years at AIG in various senior roles spanning mergers and acquisitions, planning and

budgeting, business analytics, portfolio management and business development activities. Prior to AIG, he worked in the investment banking department of Goldman Sachs where he helped companies execute capital raising transactions and review acquisition opportunities. Jeff holds a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Asian Studies from Dartmouth College and a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Chicago Booth School of Business.

TRAVIS CHRIST, Chief Commercial Officer. Travis Is responsible for all aspects of customer acquisition and revenue generation across the network. With more than 25 years of experience in revenue management, e-commerce, sales & marketing and distribution, Christ is a seasoned executive with experience leading commercial organizations in a variety of functions within the airline, travel, and telecommunications industries. At Brightline, Travis leads a team of specialists responsible for pricing and revenue management, brand and product marketing, e-commerce, partnerships, and distribution that deliver customer traffic, growth and P&L objectives. Travis started his career in network planning at Continental Airlines and holds a bachelor's degree from George Washington University, and an MBA from The American Graduate School of International Management.

CYNTHIA BERGMANN, Chief Legal Officer. Cindy is responsible for directing the legal and compliance affairs of Brightline, as well as advising senior management on all significant legal issues. She brings more than 30 years of legal experience in mergers and acquisitions, financing, real estate, corporate and regulatory matters to the role, with significant transportation industry experience. Prior to joining Brightline, Cindy was a partner with Freeborn & Peters in Chicago, where she served as co-chair of the firm's Corporate Practice Group and chair of its Transportation Industry Team. Cindy also served as the US Corporate Counsel for Canadian National Railway Company. Cindy received her Juris Doctor degree from the UIC John Marshall Law School and her BSBA in Finance and Marketing from the University of Denver. She is a past President of the Association of Transportation Law Professionals.

BRIAN KRONBERG, Senior Vice President, Development & Construction, Brian is responsible for overseeing all Brightline's development and construction initiatives throughout Florida. He has more than 18 years of experience in the construction and transportation industry and leads a cross functional team that is responsible for expanding and improving Brightline's system, which includes the development of new train stations in the Treasure Coast and Cocoa, a commuter rail system in Miami-Dade and Broward counties, adding additional safety improvements along the corridor and the company's expansion to Tampa. He manages the team responsible for site acquisition, design, construction, development, schedule, budget, quality control, environmental, and implementation of safety measures. Brian was Brightline's first fulltime employee and has played an important role in all aspects of the company with a primary focus on station and infrastructure development. Early in the project, Brian assembled the necessary land for the train stations, transit-oriented development (TOD) projects, as well as the land needed to construct the rail infrastructure. Brian was instrumental in the development of the MiamiCentral Station and most recently led the company's successful expansion into Aventura and Boca Raton with the addition of two new stations. Prior to joining Brightline in 2012, Brian was a project manager at Flagler Development where he developed large scale business parks which included several million square feet of industrial warehouses. Brian holds a Bachelor of Science in Management & Finance from Tulane University and an MBA from University of Miami.

MICHAEL LEFEVRE, Vice President of Operations, Michael leads the operations functions of safety, transportation, maintenance of way, maintenance of equipment, and mobility services. Michael is one of Brightline's longest-tenured employees, having joined the company in 2013. Michael has held a number of roles in the transportation industry including service planning at the Class I freight railroad CSX Transportation, working on a ship-docking tugboat on the Delaware River, and operating a public water taxi. In recognition of his positive impact on the industry and his commitment to improving public transportation across the country, Michael was named a *Rising Star* by *Progressive Railroading Magazine* and is a recipient of the American Public Transportation Foundation scholarship. Michael received both his Master of Business Administration and his Bachelor of Arts from Duke University.

HUSEIN CUMBER, Chief Strategy Officer at FECI. With respect to Brightline, he is responsible for guiding this major capital Project from initial concept through development. Prior to joining FECI, he worked at Florida East Coast Railway L.L.C. and led the public affairs efforts for FECI, where he secured funding for several major public-private partnership projects that increased capacity within the company's rail corridor. Mr. Cumber also served as the Assistant to the Secretary for Policy at the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and as the Deputy Chief of Staff at the USDOT. He was also nominated by President George W. Bush on May 20, 2008 to be a member of the Surface Transportation Board. Mr. Cumber received his B.A. in U.S. National Security from Duke University.

Relevant Experience in operating high-speed rail

Brightline has been in operation for six years and is the only privately operated provider of modern, eco-friendly, intercity rail in America. Brightline built and owns or controls the entire 235-mile rail system, including our track and systems, land, trains, stations and maintenance facilities.

Brightline currently operates approximately 32 departures (16 roundtrips) between Miami and Orlando with an additional 4 departures between Miami and West Palm Beach. The state-of-the-art passenger trains travel the 235-mile trip between Miami and Orlando in approximately three hours and Miami to West Palm Beach in approximately an hour. Our company prides ourselves on customer satisfaction, service and reliability and we are proud to report that last quarter we operated at 92% On Time Performance (OTP).

Brightline's passenger rail service offers business, leisure, and personal travelers safe, sustainable, fast, reliable, convenient, and comfortable travel within Southeast and Central Florida. Travelers are able to reserve specific seats on trains and at times that fit their specific travel needs. Passengers also enjoy free hi-speed WiFi on board and other amenities at Brightline's stations. Brightline's passengers are able to continue to travel car-free at their destinations; Brightline's train stations are conveniently located in city centers and near major travel destinations and offer multiple connections to other modes of transportation including local commuter rail and public ground transportation. Leisure travelers have the option to purchase integrated travel packages for fast and easy connections to major travel destinations in Miami, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach and Orlando.

Safety Record and Compliance with federal and state regulations

Safety is Brightline's top priority and something that we focus on everyday. We think about safety not just during the operations of our system, but also on all of our construction sites and projects. As of the end of 2023, our construction projects produced more than 8.5M work hours and our rate of safety incidents was well below the industry average. By way of example, our Total Recordable Incident Rate (TRIR) was 0.96. Anything below 3.0 is considered good and the industry average is 3.4. In terms of operations, train travel is one of the safest modes of transportation and the system will move millions of travelers out of their car and off of dangerous roadways.

Brightline has our own safety and security division, and our team has significant experience in the rail and transportation industries. We meet and exceed the highest standards set by the FRA and the State of Florida. We have a robust safety and security approach that focuses on education, enforcement and engineering. Our efforts include safety-related infrastructure investments throughout our rail corridor, emergency response trainings with all law enforcement agencies along the corridor, television and radio public service announcements and multiple partnerships, including with school districts, "211" chapters along our alignment and Operation Lifesaver.

Experience in high-speed rail passenger service stations

Brightline has six years of experience in operating and maintaining passenger train systems and stations. As previously stated, we currently operate and maintain each of our six stations to the highest level of service and quality. We are a model and a service that the rest of the country has noticed and admired. With service to Orlando now in operation and given the success of our Aventura and Boca Raton Stations, Brightline is now focused on building our next train station in the Treasure Coast.

SECTION 3. Agreements in Place to Utilize Adjacent Railway Track Infrastructure

Brightline Trains Florida LLC has the legal right to use the rail infrastructure adjacent to the Martin County owned parcels.

Below is the legal explanation and proof of the above-mentioned right.

Florida East Coast Railway (FECR) is the fee owner of the rail corridor known as the Florida East Coast rail corridor starting at or near Miami, Florida, and ending at or near Jacksonville, Florida, a distance of approximately 351 miles (the "FEC Corridor").

FECR granted Brightline Trains Florida LLC an easement for Passenger Railroad Service (as defined below) on the FEC Corridor and FECR and Brightline Trains Florida LLC entered into that Corrective Second Amended and Restated Grant of Passenger Service Easement (West Palm Beach to Cocoa), dated October 5, 2017, and recorded in Official Records Book 2952, Page 2948 of the Public Records of Martin County, Florida (the "Passenger Easement"), the Second Amended and Restated Joint Use Agreement (Shared Infrastructure), dated December 27, 2016, as amended by the First Amendment to Second Amended and Restated Joint Use Agreement (Shared Infrastructure) dated June 30, 2017 (as amended, the "JUA"), as evidenced by the Memorandum of Joint Use Agreement (Shared Infrastructure), dated June 30, 2017, and recorded in Official Records Book 3216, Page 2473 of the Public Records of Martin County, Florida (the "Memorandum of JUA") with respect to the shared use of the FEC Corridor.

In addition, FECR granted FDG Flagler Station II LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("FDG") an easement for Non-Railroad Purposes (as defined below) on the FEC Corridor and other property pursuant to that certain First Amended and Restated Grant of Easements between FECR and FDG dated June 13, 2014, and recorded in Official Records Book 2724, Page 1952, of the Public Records of Martin County, Florida (as may be amended, amended and restated, supplemented or otherwise modified from time to time, the "Non-Rail Easement") and FECR, FDG and Brightline Trains Florida LLC entered into that certain Amended and Restated Joint Use and Operating Agreement, dated June 13, 2014, with respect thereto, (as may be amended, amended and restated, supplemented or otherwise modified from time to time, the "Non-Rail JUA"). FDG was transferred to FECR and its name was changed to FEC ROW LLC. Therefore, FECR now owns the Non-Rail Easement and has the rights thereunder.

"Passenger Railroad Service" means any and all uses and purposes in connection with, consistent with, or relating to passenger railroad operations on, along, over, under and across the burdened property, including without limitation installing, placing, constructing, occupying, using, operating, altering, maintaining, repairing, renewing and replacing rail, ties, ballast, other track material, signals and communications facilities and equipment, utilities, stations, platforms, stairways, escalators, elevators, structures, and/or improvements that are reasonably necessary or desirable or legally required in connection with the provision of passenger railroad service; operating trains, rail cars, locomotives and other rail equipment for the movement of passengers in intercity, commuter, transit, excursion and special passenger train service; and any and all other activities that are ancillary or related to the transportation of passengers on or along the burdened property.

SECTION 4. Proposed Number of Daily Trains for the 1st Quarter of Service

During the first three months of service, Brightline anticipates stopping a total of eight trains per day at the Martin County Station.

The eight trains per day is subject to schedule feasibility and operational impact as determined by a Rail Traffic Controller ("RTC") model.

Brightline is currently preparing the RTC model that will be shared with Florida East Coast Railway, L.L.C. ("FECR"). The RTC model is required to show that the addition of the train station and the rail infrastructure on the system does not unreasonably interfere with the movement of Brightline's and FECR's trains on the System.

Brightline anticipates strong ridership from Martin County and will use these eight trains per day to better understand customer demand and travel preference. Although operating hours for the first three months have not yet been established, Brightline anticipates trains stopping at this station throughout the day and into the evening.

SECTION 5. Existing Network That Martin County Residents Will Have Access To

On September 22, 2023, Brightline Trains Florida, LLC (Brightline) achieved a monumental milestone, ushering in a new era of transportation in the United States. As the nation's sole privately owned and operated intercity passenger rail service, Brightline launched its highly anticipated route connecting Miami to Orlando, featuring stops in Aventura, Fort Lauderdale, Boca Raton, and West Palm Beach. This historic occasion marked the culmination of a visionary project that has been a decade in the making, forever altering the landscape of regional and national transportation networks in Florida. Brightline's rail system, infrastructure and stations represent an investment of approximately \$6 billion.


Brightline's current stations are located in downtown population centers, strategically placed to maximize convenience for travelers and commuters, with access to major destinations, public transportation links, and urban amenities. Each station includes first/last mile transit options that enable guests to reach their final destination.

Brightline's MiamiCentral station is a major transportation hub in downtown Miami, offering extensive connectivity options that make it a gateway for both local and regional travel. MiamiCentral includes direct connections to Tri-Rail, Metrorail, and the downtown Metromover.

Brightline's Orlando station is located at Orlando International Airport which serves approximately 60 million passengers annually.

Brightline is actively working on a Tampa Extension, which will extend service from Orlando International Airport to Orlando Area station(s) and then to downtown Tampa.

The growing population and tourism in Florida will place heavy demands on the existing transportation network, which is already congested and unable meet the current transportation demand. There also be heightened will in meeting the challenges mobility needs of the diverse population - from seniors to lower-income residents to persons with disabilities to visitors unfamiliar with the area. The state's transportation system needs mobility options that are safe, efficient, and



improve the quality of life for residents and visitors. Passenger rail is a vital tool to help manage future growth under constrained conditions that limit the ability to expand highways.

A station in Martin County would integrate into our existing rail network and dramatically improve access for residents and visitors of Martin County. A Martin County station would sit in the middle of Brightline's current system offering passengers access to South and Central Florida. The station would offer the following approximate travel times:

- Miami 1h53m
- Aventura 1h32m
- Fort Lauderdale 1h16m
- Boca Raton 1h3m
- West Palm Beach 40m
- Orlando 1h46m

<u>SECTION 6.</u> Price Proposal Detailing the Cost Structure for Operating the High-Speed Rail Service

Brightline anticipates that the annual cost for operating the Martin County station will be approximately \$2.3M per year for the costs directly attributable to the station. In addition to the \$2.3M (and not currently included in the estimate) are other costs that we will incur related to property taxes and corporate overhead. This operating cost will grow over time with escalation and inflation.

The \$2.3M includes the cost directly attributable to the station: station labor (\$1.3M), maintenance and operational expenses (\$900k) and insurance (\$200k).

Station Labor

The station labor may include guest service agents, station managers, station assistant managers and security personnel. We anticipate having approximately 25 full-time equivalent employees.

Other Maintenance and Operational Costs

The other maintenance and operational expenses (\$900k) covers purchased services that would include annual operating maintenance / repairs, external security, marketing, lawn maintenance, electrical consumption, water consumption, pest control and other cost that may arise on any given year.

Land Rent and Desired Lease Term

Term: Brightline seeks to have an initial lease term of 40 years with three options for Brightline to extend the term; first for an additional 40 years, and thereafter for two additional twenty (20) year extension terms. Each extension would be exercisable in Brightline's sole discretion and be exercised by delivery of a written notice by Brightline to the County at least one year before

the expiration of the then expiring term. Brightline shall have the right to extend the lease so long as no default exists at the time of such exercise and at the time of renewal.

Rent: Brightline proposes to pay \$12 per year to lease the land.

Project: To design and construct a passenger train station, platform, parking and rail infrastructure. The exact size of the station, platform and parking have not yet been determined. At the time of this submittal, it is unclear if the preference by the County is to have surface parking or a parking garage. If selected, Brightline will work with the County staff to determine the appropriate parking solution within the County's budget.

Capital Cost: Martin County will fund up to \$15M towards the overall Project Cost. Project Costs means all costs associated with the Project, including but not limited to, design, engineering, procurement, project management, construction, utility work, environmental, permitting, legal, construction-period insurance, testing and commissioning of the Project hereunder (whether incurred before or after the Effective Date of the Lease), the other work performed by Tenant hereunder. The balance of the funds necessary to pay for the Project Costs shall be obtained from Federal and/–or state grants. Martin County will be the lead on preparing the grant applications along with Brightline's support and cooperation. If by June 30, 2027 the County has not entered into a grant agreement that includes the necessary funds to complete the project, then in accordance with the proposed Amendment to the Settlement Agreement, Brightline shall have the right to terminate the lease.

Maintenance and Utilities: Brightline will be responsible for the maintenance of the station and parking and will pay utilities and taxes relating to the station and parking. Brightline will also be responsible for providing casualty insurance for the station and parking.

Ownership: Brightline will own the station building and parking improvements over the term of the lease. At the end of the term, the improvements will revert to the County.

Brightline's obligations under the lease shall be subject to a condition precedent that Brightline and the County enter into an amendment (in form and substance reasonably satisfactory to Brightline and the County) to that certain Settlement Agreement dated as of November 25, 2018, by and among the County, Citizens Against Rail Expansion in Florida and Brightline (the "Settlement Agreement") to provide (a) for an extension of the time period within which Brightline will build a station in the Treasure Coast to the later of five (5) years from (i) the date of execution of the Amendment or (ii) the date of execution of a grant agreement by the County for the balance of the Project Costs; and (b) that in the event that the County is unable to obtain grant funding for the balance of the Project Cost by June 30, 2027, or if the County fails to contribute the local match (up to \$15M), then Brightline shall be relieved of any obligation to build a station within the Treasure coast under the Settlement Agreement.

SECTION 7. Information Regarding Any Legal or Administrative Actions

There are no past or pending legal or administrative actions that would impact the ability for Brightline to complete the train station in Martin County.

On Oct. 23, our board of directors voted unanimously to send this letter recognizing your leadership, responsiveness and decisive action.

As the county's official economic development organization, the Business Development Board of Martin County (BDBMC) views and supports the BOCC's decision through the prism of one of our core responsibilities—helping foster a pro-business climate that complements the unique qualities of our community. We applied your actions because:


