- Increased awareness of Martin County's Art in Public Places program through creative engagement










1. What do you hope public art does for the community? (Select all that apply)




2. How important is public art to the quality of life in Martin County?



3. What types of public art should the County prioritize? (Select all that apply)




**4. Where do you think public art would have the greatest impact in Martin County?
