### **BUSINESS IMPACT ESTIMATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 125.66(3), FLA. STAT.**

The ordinance would require sexual offenders, sexual predators, convicted felons, and career offenders, who are required by law to register with the Martin County Sheriff's Office, to pay a registration fee.
