RE: Roundabout construction on CR-723 (NE Savannah Road) at NE Cov Senda Impacts to Homeowners Association's property

Mr. Franco:

Sunshine Land Design Inc. (Sunshine), on behalf of the Martin County Capital Projects Division, will soon begin construction of a roundabout on CR-723 (NE Savannah Road) at NE Coy Senda. The roundabout was designed to facilitate ingress and egress from NE Savannah Road to Jensen Park Estates and The Reserves at Jensen Beach. There are monument signs on the northwest and southwest corners of the intersection and there is an informational sign in the median of NE Cov Senda. All these signs are lighted and are in the County's right-of-way. The power for the lighting is provided and metered by Florida Power & Light (FPL).

During design, the engineers considered the proximity of the monument signs and we do not anticipate that these monument signs will be impacted. However, we will need to relocate the informational sign in the median. We will ask Sunshine's project supervisor to coordinate with you for the relocation of the informational sign.

The power for the lights is fed from a pole in the median of SE Coy Senda. In collaboration with its recent hardening project and in anticipation of the roundabout, FPL will soon remove the pole, thereby disconnecting power to the lights. There are two options for restoring power to the lights. You can either pay FPL for the relocation and continued cost of the electric service or you can replace the lights with solar powered lights that can be readily found at any home improvement or discount store.


