It is located next to a residential zone with new homes and Cove Road is a designated truck route. Between Rt. 1 and SR76 it is 3.1 miles of a 2 lane road with 4 large gated communit a middle school for over 1,000 students, a commercial garden center, a large Catholic churc a nursing home, and on the Rt.1 end, a gas station and a Walgreens. Right now, certain tim of the day, the traffic is already extremely congested, especially during the months the schowould be open.

Why is another school needed right now? With the taxpayers forced to pay for a charter sc how is it that we weren't able to vote for or against it? Just exactly how much did the prop cost and what is the proposed cost of construction?
