THE BOARD OF COUNTY A RESOLUTION OF COMMISSIONERS OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, RELATING TO THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE: RATIFYING CREATION OF THE SOLID WASTE **MUNICIPAL SERVICE** BENEFIT **UNIT:** ASSESSMENTS AGAINST **CERTAIN IMPOSING** RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE SOLID WASTE MUNICIPAL SERVICE BENEFIT UNIT; APPROVING THE ASSESSMENT ROLL FOR THE SOLID WASTE MUNICIPAL SERVICE BENEFIT UNIT; CONFIRMING RESOLUTION: THE INITIAL ASSESSMENT PROVIDING FOR COLLECTION **OF** THE ASSESSMENTS AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on July 30, 2019, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Martin County, Florida (the "County") adopted Resolution No. 19-7.7 (the "Initial Assessment Resolution"), ratifying and confirming the creation of the Solid Waste Municipal Service Benefit Unit and describing the method of assessing the Collection Cost and Disposal Cost of the Residential Services (as such terms are defined in the Initial Assessment Resolution) against the real property that will be specially benefited thereby, and directing the preparation of the preliminary Assessment Roll and provision of the notices required by applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the Board is required by Chapter 151 of the Martin County Code to confirm or repeal the Initial Assessment Resolution, with such amendments as the Board deems appropriate, after hearing comments and receiving objections of all interested parties; and

WHEREAS, the Assessment Roll has heretofore been filed with the office of the County Administrator, as required by Chapter 151 of the Martin County Code; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing has been published and mailed to each real property owner proposed to be assessed, notifying such real property owner of the opportunity to be heard; the proof of publication and an affidavit of mailing are attached hereto as Appendices A and B respectively; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been duly held and comments and objections of all interested persons have been heard and considered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY. This resolution is adopted pursuant to Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, Chapter 151 of the Martin County Code and other applicable provisions of law.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. All capitalized terms in this resolution shall have the meanings defined in the Initial Assessment Resolution.

SECTION 3. ASSESSMENTS.

(A) Single Family Dwelling Units located in the Solid Waste Municipal Service Benefit Unit are hereby found to be specially benefited by the provision of Residential Services. The computation of the Assessment for each Single Family Dwelling Unit set forth in Appendix D hereto is hereby approved. An Assessment of \$314.37 is hereby levied and imposed against each Tax Parcel containing a Single Family Dwelling Unit located in the Solid Waste Municipal Service Benefit Unit.

(B) The Assessments imposed hereby shall constitute a lien equal in rank and dignity with the liens of all state, county, district or municipal taxes and other non-ad valorem assessments. Except as otherwise provided by law, such lien shall be superior in dignity to all other liens, titles and claims, until the ad valorem tax bill for such year is otherwise paid in full pursuant to the Uniform Assessment Collection Act. The lien for Assessments shall be deemed perfected upon adoption by the Board of this Final Assessment Resolution. Upon perfection, the lien for Assessments collected under the Uniform Assessment Collection Act shall attach to the Tax Parcels assessed hereunder as of the prior January 1, the lien date for ad valorem taxes.

SECTION 4. CONFIRMATION OF INITIAL RESOLUTION. The Initial Assessment Resolution is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Roll prepared by direction of the County Administrator, which is currently on file and open to public inspection in the office of the County Utilities Department (as designated by the County Administrator) and incorporated herein by reference, is hereby approved.

SECTION 6. COLLECTION OF ASSESSMENTS. The Assessments imposed hereby shall be collected pursuant to the Uniform Assessment Collection Act. The County Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to certify and deliver or cause the certification and delivery of the Assessment Roll to the Tax Collector, in the manner prescribed by Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes. The Assessment Roll, as delivered to the Tax Collector, shall be accompanied by a Certificate to Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll in substantially the form attached hereto as Appendix C.

SECTION 7. EFFECT OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION. The adoption of this Final Assessment Resolution shall be the final adjudication of the issues presented herein and in the Initial Assessment Resolution (including, but not limited to, the apportionment methodology, the legislative determinations of special benefit and fair apportionment, the rate of assessment, the adoption of the Assessment Roll and the levy and lien of Board action on the Assessments), unless proper steps shall be initiated in a court of competent jurisdiction to secure relief within 20 days from the date of this Final Assessment Resolution.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.



NOTICE OF HEARING TO IMPOSE AND PROVIDE FOR COLLECTION OF NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENT

Notice is hereby given that the Board of County Commissioners of Martin County, Florida, will conduct a public hearing to impose a non-ad valorem assessment against certain single family dwelling units located on parcels of improved residential property located in the Solid Waste Municipal Service Benefit Unit, as shown above. The hearing will be held on August 27, 2019 at 9:00 A.M. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard in the County Commission Chambers of the Martin County Administration Building at 2401 S. E. Monterey Road, Stuart, Florida. The Assessment has been proposed to fund the cost of collection and disposal of residential solid waste; the collection, transportation, and delivery of residential recyclable materials; and the collection and disposal of residential yard trash, each from certain single family residential dwelling units. The special assessment for single family dwelling units will be based upon the solid waste collection, transportation, and disposal costs attributable to such single family dwelling unit.

A more specific description is set forth in the Initial Assessment Resolution adopted by the County Commission on July 30, 2019. Copies of the Initial Assessment Resolution and the preliminary assessment roll are available and open to public inspection at the offices of the County Utilities Department (as designated by

the County Administrator) located at 3473 SE Willoughby Blvd, Suite 102, Stuart, Florida.

The special assessment will be collected on the ad valorem tax bill, as authorized by Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes. Failure to pay the special assessment will cause a tax certificate to be issued against the property which may result in a loss of title.
