• SB 0410 GROWTH MANAGEMENT

• This bill prohibits counties from adopting a comprehensive plan, a land development regulation, or another form of restriction unless certain conditions are met. This bill also requires local governments to include a property rights element in their comprehensive plans and provides that certain property owners are not required to consent to development agreement changes under certain circumstances.

## "CLEAN WATERWAYS ACT"

- Rule making to update the stormwater design and operation regulations.
- Wastewater grant program establishedprojects to convert septic systems to sewer are prioritized; 50 percent local match
- · Rules for biosolids management.
- Requires DEP to submit a report identifying sanitary sewer overflows from wastewater treatment facilities.
- Prohibits local governments from recognizing or granting any legal right to a plant, animal, body of water, or any other part of the natural environment that is not a person or political subdivision; or from granting a person or political subdivision any specific rights relating to the natural environment.



o SB 1066 IMPACT FEES

 This bill prohibits new or increased impact fees from applying to certain applications and provides that impact fee credits are assignable and transferable under certain conditions.

o SB 0362 FLORIDA TOURISM MARKETING

 This bill revises the scheduled repeal of the Florida Tourism Industry Marketing Corporation directsupport organization and repeals the scheduled repeal of the Division of Tourism Marketing of Enterprise Florida, Inc.

O HB 0279 LOCAL GOVERNMENT PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION WORKS

 This bill requires disclosure requirements for bidding documents and other requests for proposals issued for bids by a local governmental entity and public contracts entered between local governmental entities and contractors.

o SB 0810 TOBACCO AND NICOTINE PRODUCTS

The bill raises the smoking age of tobacco to 21 and expands the definition of tobacco and tobacco products. The House amended the bill to create a limited retail tobacco products dealer permit for those retailers selling only vaping products without the need of a permit or fee.

o HB 7097 TAXATION

The tax package was significantly paired back during committee and the Senate Floor. The total statewide impact of the tax package is \$56.9 million non-recurring (1st year) and \$7.5 million recurring revenues. The total estimated impact to counties of the tax package is \$10.2 million nonrecurring (1st year) and \$3.2 million recurring revenues.
