Committee Powers & Duties:

The Local Technology Planning Team (LTPT) was created in accordance with Section 288.9961(4)(b) Florida Statutes. The LTPT shall have the duty and responsibility to advise/make recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners and staff in matters affecting the advancement of broadband service and infrastructure in Martin County.

The LTPT shall:

- A. Work with rural communities to help the communities understand their current broadband availability.
- B. Locate unserved and underserved, as defined in Section 288.9961(2), businesses and residents.
- C. Identify assets relevant to Broadband deployment.
- D. Build partnerships with Broadband service providers.
- E. Identify opportunities to leverage assets and reduce barriers to the deployment of broadband Internet services in the community.

Vacant positions: Local Broadband and Internet Service Provider representative and a Martin County Health Care Provider Representative.

Meetings will be held biannually or more frequently and held at the Administration Building (2401 SE Monterey Road, Stuart). Failure to attend three consecutive meetings is grounds for automatic removal from the committee.
