PERMISSION TO APPLY

1. PERMISSION TO APPLY FOR FUNDING FROM THE FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT FOR DERELICT VESSEL REMOVAL

- Requestor Building Department
- **Granting Agency –** Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND)
- <u>Project Description</u> Eleven vessels throughout the waterways of Martin County have been determined to be derelict. Martin County, through its derelict vessel program, hired a contractor to remove the vessels from the water and dispose of them. The FIND grant program may fund up to 75% of removal costs, with a total annual cap of \$75,000 per fiscal year per county.
- Requested Grant award \$31,492.50
- <u>Budgetary Impact</u> The grant match of \$10,497.50 is available in the County's derelict vessel removal program and has already been expended for these vessels.
- Annual operating costs This is a one-time event.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION:

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> The derelict vessels will still need to be removed by the County.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> Martin County will be responsible for 100% of the removal costs, \$41,990.

 Move that the Board authorize staff to apply for funding from FIND for 75% of the costs up to \$31,492.50 to remove the 11 derelict vessels.
