Deputies: Florida teen tried to kill parents over girlfriend

JAY — A 15-year-old boy is accused of trying to kill his parents after they'd tried to make him stop seeing his girlfriend.

The Pensacola News Journal reported the boy is charged with attempted homicide, arson and resisting a law enforcement officer after he shot his father in the leg on Sunday.

An arrest report says the teen's parents dis-

covered "inappropriate messages" the boy and his girlfriend had exchanged. But the couple continued dating.

The newspaper reports the teen attempted to make a homemade firebomb. Many of the details are redacted in the arrest report.

During Sunday's altercation with his parents, the gun went off and Santa Rosa County Sheriff's officials say the father suffered a leg injury that is not considered life-threatening.

The teen is being held

without bond.

Man captures giant alligator on Florida's Lake Okeechobee

LAKE OKEECHOBEE — An airline pilot and two friends captured an alligator nearly 12-feet long on Florida's Lake Okeechobee.

Jim Howard of Cooper City tells WPLG he spotted the gator just before sunset on Aug. 16. He lured the gator with bait and used a multi-pronged grappling hook to pull it close. A friend

and his son soon joined him on the boat and pulled the alligator in close before using a bang stick to shoot it in the skull.

He says it took an hour and a half to haul in the 1,000-pound gator.

Cooper had a permit from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, which has allowed alligator hunting since 1988.

He plans to have purses and wallets made from the skin and keep the skull.

Launches

Sept. 24: An air-launched Northrop Grumman Pegasus XL rocket will deploy NASA's Ionospheric Connection Explorer (ICON) satellite into orbit. ICON will study the ionosphere, a region of Earth's upper atmosphere where terrestrial weather meets

space weather. Disturbances in the ionosphere triggered by solar storms or weather activity in the lower atmosphere can cause disturbances in GPS navigation and radio transmissions. Launch window: 4 to 5:30 a.m.

Oct. 4: A United Launch Alliance Atlas 5 rocket, designated AV-073, will launch the fourth Advanced Extremely High Frequency (AEHF) satellite. Built by Lockheed Martin, this U.S. military spacecraft will provide highly-secure communications. The rocket will fly in the 551 vehicle configuration with a five-meter fairing, five solid rocket boosters and a single-engine Centaur upper stage. Launch time: 11:07 p.m.

Nov. 29: A SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket will launch the 18th Dragon space-

craft mission on its 16th operational cargo delivery flight to the International Space Station. The flight is being conducted under the Commercial Resupply Services contract with NASA. Launch window: TBD

Dec. 13: A United Launch Alliance Delta 4 rocket will launch the 10th Wideband Global SATCOM spacecraft, formerly known as the Wideband Gapfiller Satellite. Built by Boeing, this geostationary communications spacecraft will serve U.S. military forces. The rocket will fly in the Medium+ (5,4) configuration with four solid rocket boosters. Launch window: TBD

NOTICE OF HEARING TO IMPOSE AND PROVIDE FOR COLLECTION OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

Notice is hereby given that the Board of County Commissioners of Martin County, Florida, will conduct a public hearing to consider creation of the **S.W. Honey Terrace Municipal Service Benefit Unit**, as shown above, and to impose special assessments against certain parcels of property located therein. The public hearing was previously scheduled to occur on August 21, 2018. The hearing will now be held at 9:00 A.M., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, on September 11, 2018 in the County Commission Chambers of the Martin County Administration Building at 2401 S.E. Monterey Road, Stuart, Florida for the purpose of receiving public comment on the proposed MSBU and assessments. If you are a person with a disability who needs any accommodation in order to participate in this proceeding, you are entitled, at no cost to you, to the provision of certain assistance. Please contact the Office of the County Administrator at 772-221-2360, or in writing to 2401 S.E. Monterey Road, Stuart, Florida 34996, at least three days prior to the public hearing. If you are hearing or voice impaired, please call 772-288-5940. All affected property owners have a right to appear at the hearing and to file written objections with the Board of County Commissioners within 20 days of this notice. If a person wishes to appeal any decision made by the Board of County Commissioners with respect to any matter considered at the hearing, such person will need a record of the proceedings and may need to insure that a verbatim record is made, including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be made.

The Assessments have been proposed to fund construction of road improvements. The assessment for each parcel of property will be based upon the total number of parcel units (approximate number of potential dwelling units permitted to be built on each parcel of record for single family dwelling units or acreage for non-residential use). A more specific description is set forth in the Initial Assessment Resolution adopted by the County Commission on July 10, 2018. Copies of the Initial Assessment Resolution, the plans and specifications for the road improvements and the preliminary assessment roll are available for inspection at the offices of the County Public Works Department (as designated by the County Administrator), located at 2401 S.E. Monterey Road, Stuart, Florida.

The assessments will be collected on the ad valorem tax bill, as authorized by Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes. Failure to pay the assessments will cause a tax certificate to be issued against the property which may result in a loss of title. The County Commission intends to collect the assessments in ten (10) annual assessments, the first of which will be included on the ad valorem tax bill to be mailed in November 2018. Future annual assessments may be prepaid, in whole, at the option of the property owner.
