## A Proclamation

Declaring National Safe Boating Week in Martin County, Florida

- Whereas, on average, 650 people die annually in boating-related accidents in the United States of which nearly 76% are caused by drowning and 85% of victims are not wearing a life jacket; and
  Whereas, a significant number of boaters who lose their lives by drowning each year would be alive today had they worn their life jackets; and
  Wherea the vast majority of these accidents are caused by human error or poor
- **EXAMPLE 1** the vast majority of these accidents are caused by human error or poor judgment and not by the boat, equipment, or environmental factors; and **S**,
- modern life jackets are more comfortable, more attractive, and more wearable than styles of years past and deserve a fresh look by today's boating public; and
- PhereaFlotilla 59 of the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, based in Martin County's Sandsprit Park, participates in the annual National Safe Boating Week campaign to promote boating safety and encourages the boating public to wear life jackets when enjoying the region's waterways.

Now, therefore, be it proclaimed by the Martin County Board of County Commissioners is commending the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 59 for their efforts in furthering the goals of the National Safe Boating Week campaign, May 18-24, 2019 and their year-round efforts to promote safe boating.
