Kiplinger Remaining Obligations


- Wildlife Hospital and adjacent care taker housing facility
 - Reasons for removal from the agreement:
 - -A new Location of the Treasure Coast Animal Hospital was developed post GAA
 - -Such development would negatively impact critical native habitat and decrease recreational opportunity in the county -Cost of building such a development would be significant(\$1.35 million)

-Martin County BOCC has an agreement to financially support the Treasure Coast Animal Hospital (\$40,000/yearly)

Proposed alternative to Wildlife Hospital

- Improve existing parking area with new entrance and increased capacity.
- Construct a picnic pavilion onsite
- Create a new canoe/kayak launch that will connect to the St.
 Lucie river and Martin County Paddle trail


Conceptual Plan

Bob Graham Beach Addition Remaining Obligations

Proposed alternative to Agreement

- Modify FCT Boundary to include existing Martin County Conservation lands to fulfill agreement obligations;
 - Properties would include:

 Beachwalk Pasley
 Bob Graham Addition
 Joe River Park

Reason for amendment to Agreement

- Martin county has already invested in adjacent lands that would fulfill requirements.
- Environmental impacts to beach dune coastal strand and tidal swamp would be negative and significant.
- There would be a direct loss of habitat to native flora and fauna. (including significant mangrove removal)
- Recreational access already exists through adjacent Martin County managed lands.
- Overall need for new access is not needed as per Parks and Recreation department.
- The cost to Martin county would be significant (\$1.4 million).

Next Steps:
