- 1. PERMISSION TO APPLY FOR A JOINT PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT FOR THE STATE FY20 FUNDING ALLOCATION OF SECTION 5311 NON-URBANIZED AREA FORMULA FUNDS FOR OPERATING AND/OR CAPITAL ASSISTANCE
 - <u>Requestor</u> Public Works/Transit Division
 - Granting Agency Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)
 - <u>Project Description</u> Provide operating assistance to continue the Indiantown non-urbanized bus route services.
 - Requested Grant Award \$114,816
 - <u>Budgetary Impact</u> Grant Match of \$114,816 will be budgeted in the Public Works/Transit operating budget.
 - Annual Operating Cost Staff time for grant administration.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION:

- **Programmatic Implication if not approved** The Indiantown non-urbanized bus route services will be reduced or discontinued.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> Martin County would not receive \$114,816 in non-urbanized grant funding.

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2. Permission to Apply for the FY 2019-2020 E911 State Grant for Phone Monitors

- Requestor Martin County Board of County Commissioners
- Granting Agency State of Florida E911 Board
- Project Description Martin County is transitioning to Next Generation 911 (NG911) technology to include text-to-911. As we adapt to NG911, new media applications will provide visual information, such as images or video to enhance Telecommunicators' ability to efficiently process emergency calls. The phone monitors at each console require an upgrade to provide extra space for the delivery of additional information. This will improve the current display for call processing and enable emergency communication alternatives for the hearing impaired and the disabled community. Additionally, wall monitors are necessary to display emergency information to allow Telecommunicators to simultaneously access and collaborate emergency operations. Martin County's mapping system is equipped with Geographic Information Systems (GIS) technology providing real-time geographic intelligence to locate callers and emergency services nearby. The Multi-Queue Display (MQD) provides call statistics to maintain quality assurance and minimum requirements according to the E911 State Plan.
- Requested Grant Award \$13,676.28
- **Budgetary Impact** Grant funds will be provided on a cost reimbursement basis.
- Annual Operating Cost Staff time for grant administration.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION:

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> The current phone monitors are
 not capable of providing additional information to Telecommunicators due to the
 size capacity. Without the county map and MQD wall display,
 Telecommunicators will continue to rely on old technology. This can cause
 delays to life saving emergency services.
- Financial Fiscal Impact if not approved Our current limited E911 fund revenues are insufficient to maintain and upgrade the E911 system and are unable to provide for future improvements. Without the utilization of grant funds, Martin County cannot complete the transition to NG911 services.

- **Granting Agency –** State of Florida E911 Board
- Project Description Martin County is transitioning to Next Generation 911
 (NG911) technology. RapidSOS is an advanced emergency technology system
 that delivers more precise wireless location and rich data to the
 Telecommunicators to effectively process calls. Our Public Safety Answering
 Points (PSAPs) will require enhanced software to allow full integration with the
 RapidSOS and our Vesta call handling equipment.
- Requested Grant Award \$15,796.56
- Budgetary Impact Grant funds will be provided on a cost reimbursement basis.
- Annual Operating Cost Staff time for grant administration.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION:

- Programmatic Implication if not approved RapidSOS is an industry leader
 in transmitting NG911 data such as devise location and additional information
 to PSAPs. RapidSOS delivers more accurate caller location to the PSAPs and
 without it our information on where the caller is located can be unreliable. This
 can cause emergency services to be misrouted and delayed.
- <u>Financial Fiscal Impact if not approved</u> Our current limited E911 fund revenues are insufficient to maintain and upgrade the E911 system and are unable to provide for future improvements. Without the utilization of grant funds, Martin County cannot complete the transition to NG911 services.

 - <u>Agreement/Contract drafted by:</u> State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)
 - Parties to the Agreement/Contract: FDOT and the Martin County Board of County Commissioners

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- Purpose of the Agreement/Contract: Amendment #2 to contract G0Z79 increases the total grant funding by \$19,580 to cover the increase in cost of construction via Change Order #1 to the Contract.

5. Permission to Accept the E911 State Grant for GIS Management

The State of Florida E911 Board has approved a grant award in the amount of \$19,800 for E911 revenue funds to improve the E911 system serving our county. Vesta Solutions Inc. will provide the installation of SpatialStation 911 Datamaster (GIS mapping) software to support the transition to Next Generation 911 (NG911) technology for emergency call routing. The software enables the enhancement to the current E911 Operating System for future technology. Providing the necessary tools to ensure efficient emergency services for the safety and protection of Martin County citizens. Without this software, operational technology will be insufficient for the deployment of NG911 call routing. Grant funds will be provided on a cost reimbursement basis. Duration of the grant award is March 20, 2019 through March 20, 2020
