- **Thereas**, the mission of the Military Order of the Purple Heart is to foster an environment of goodwill among the combat wounded veterans and their families, promote patriotism, support legislative initiatives and, most importantly, make sure we never forget; and
- **Whereas.** Martin County appreciates the sacrifices our Purple Heart recipients have made in defending our freedoms and acknowledges them for their courage.

Now, therefore, be it proclaimed by the Martin County Board of County Commissioners that August 7 is Purple Heart Day in Martin County, Florida. Further, local Purple Heart recipients, and all Martin County veterans, are commended and thanked for their service to our great nation.
