1. <u>PERMISSION TO APPLY FOR THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY FLORIDA</u> JOB GROWTH FUND

- **<u>Requestor</u>** Department of Administration
- <u>Granting Agency</u> Florida Department of Economic Opportunity Florida Job Growth Grant Fund
- Project Description The extension of utilities to the Seven Js Industrial Park located west of the Martin County landfill will encourage economic development. These grant funds will be used to offset the costs to provide water and wastewater to approximately 34 industrial and commercial properties located just east of Interstate 95 north and SR 714 in Martin County. Most of these lands, owned by 18 different entities, are vacant and restricted to using limited sized septic tanks, reducing the potential for job creation and economic activity for Martin County. Data collected for the first quarter of 2018 shows almost 2,000 St. Lucie County residents traveled into this area to work. This data demonstrates the potential for additional job creation throughout this part of the County.
- Requested Grant Award \$2,250,000
- Budgetary Impact Grant Match of \$2,250,000 budgeted from Private Utility
 Assessments
- <u>Annual Operating Cost</u> Staff time for grant administration.

5. <u>PERMISSION TO ACCEPT THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT) LOCAL</u> <u>AGENCY PROGRAM (LAP) AGREEMENT FOR THE PORT SALERNO ELEMENTARY SIDEWALKS</u> (SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL) PROJECT (FM# 439979-1-58-01)

- <u>Agreement/Contract drafted by:</u> State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)
- Parties to the Agreement/Contract: FDOT and the Martin County Board of County Commissioners
- Purpose of the Agreement/Contract: To provide funding for this project up to \$415,557. The total estimated cost of the project is \$615,073 and will consist of construction of 4,572 LF of new sidewalk to the South of the Port Salerno Elementary School. New sidewalks, ADA sidewalk ramps and crosswalks will be added on segments of SE Kingfish Avenue, SE Seaward Street, SE Horizon Avenue, SE Ebbtide Avenue and a stormwater ditch/canal that abuts the South side of the elementary school property.
- New/Renewal/Modified: New
- <u>Duration</u>: Martin County agrees to complete the project on or before December 31, 2021 (date of Agreement expiration).
- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u>: Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan requires that the County provide sidewalk facilities to meet the needs of pedestrians, construct sidewalks on Collectors and Arterials (Policy 5.4A.4), develop sidewalk and bicycle facilities improvement program (Policy 5.4A.5), prioritize needed sidewalks & bicycle facilities (Policy 5.4A.6), and identify & seek funding for sidewalk and bicycle facilities (Policy 5.4A.7). The County shall give priority to projects identified in adopted Community Redevelopment Plans for the CRA areas that provide infrastructure improvements (Policy 14.1A.10). In addition, Federal regulations require upgrades to meet ADA accessibility.
- <u>Cost to Martin County:</u>
 - Costs in excess of the programmed funding are attributable to actions which have not received the required approval of FDOT shall not be considered eligible costs and shall be funded with Port Salerno CRA Tax Increment Funds (TIF).
 - Annual maintenance cost is estimated to be \$1,000 per year.
 - Staff time to administer the grant.

- <u>Parties to the Agreement/Contract:</u> FDOT and the Martin County Board of County Commissioners (on behalf of the City of Stuart)
- <u>Purpose of the Agreement/Contract</u>: To provide funding for this project up to \$320,679. The project scope consists of sidewalk construction on NW Dixie Highway (from approximately 200' north of NW Wright Boulevard to NE Dixie Highway at NW Green River Parkway).
- New/Renewal/Modified: New
- **<u>Duration</u>**: Martin County agrees to complete the project on or before December 31, 2021 (date of Agreement expiration).
- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u>: The grant funding will provide for new public facilities and/or improvements that eliminate public hazards.
- <u>Background Information</u>: The County and City have agreed to cooperate in the implementation of the project whereby the County, utilizes its Local Agency Program (LAP) certification and eligibility to participate in the FDOT's Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) grant program, and will contract for construction of the project on the City's behalf via an Interlocal Agreement.
- Cost to Martin County:
 - Per the Interlocal Agreement, the City acknowledges and agrees that it will be solely liable to the County for all costs associated with the project not covered by the grant. Prior to the County's issuance of a Notice to Proceed to the Contractor, the City agrees to provide: 1) the total Bid Award, including a fifteen percent (15%) contingency amount, 2) the full negotiated contract amount for CEI services, and 3) twenty thousand, seven hundred seventy-five dollars (\$20,775) non-refundable Contract Administration Fee outlined in Exhibit "B" of the Interlocal Agreement.

- <u>Parties to the Agreement/Contract</u> Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Coastal Office, Resilient Coasts Program and Martin County Board of County Commissioners.
- <u>Purpose of the Agreement/Contract</u> Grant award of \$75,000 to complete a vulnerability assessment, create a resiliency plan for Martin County and fulfill the Community Rating System's (CRS) component 452.b pertaining to sea level rise response through a watershed master plan.
 - Sea level rise and changing precipitation patterns and events present one of the most immediate stressors facing in our region. The proposed work will formalize lines of communication and project coordination initiated in the resiliency planning group. When completed, the adopted plan will add weight to grant proposals for planned resiliency-related projects (road elevation, storm water control, coastal erosion, mosquito borne illness and more), and qualify these projects for funding under resiliency grant opportunities. Successfully meeting the CRS component 452.b will result in reduced flood insurance rates for county property owners. It will improve our compliance with the Peril of Flood statute (Sec. 163.3178(2)(f) F.S.) and allow the County to responsibly plan for predicted future conditions.
- New/Renewal/Modified This is a new contract.
- **Duration** Upon execution until June 30, 2020
- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u> Work funded by this grant will result in an increased ability to incorporate resiliency into county project designs, efficiently prioritize storm damage mitigation projects, and plan for the preservation of natural systems.
- <u>Cost to Martin County</u> An additional \$50,000 will be required to complete this project and these dollars are programmed in the FY20 Budget. Staff time to administer the grant.

- Purpose of the Agreement/Contract Grant award of \$125,000 for funding restoration repairs at the Old Martin County Courthouse, currently used by the Arts Council of Martin County as the Courthouse Cultural Center. This structure has a national and local historic designation. The Old Courthouse was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1997 and to Martin County's Historic Register in 2007.

These monitors are necessary tools to ensure efficient emergency services for the safety and protection of Martin County citizens. Without the utilization of grant funds Martin County cannot complete the transition to Next Generation 911 (NG911) services. Grant funds will be provided on a cost reimbursement basis. The duration of the grant award is June 12, 2019 through June 12, 2020. There are no additional costs or maintenance fees related to these items.

Vesta Solutions Inc. will provide the installation of enhanced window software to allow integration with the RapidSOS technology. RapidSOS provides access to emergency locations for Telecommunicators to effectively process calls. RapidSOS is an advanced emergency technology system that delivers more precise wireless location and rich data to the Telecommunicators during call processing.

This integration is necessary to ensure efficient emergency services for the safety and protection of Martin County citizens. Without the utilization of grant funds Martin County cannot complete the transition to Next Generation 911 (NG911) services. Grant funds will be provided on a cost reimbursement basis. The duration of the grant award is June 12, 2019 through June 12, 2020. There are no additional costs or maintenance fees related to these items.

13. <u>REQUEST TO APPROVE BUDGET RESOLUTION FOR THE STATE FY20 ALLOCATION OF FEDERAL</u> HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION (FHWA) FUNDS FOR THE MPO

The Martin MPO is the recipient of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) metropolitan planning funds (PL funds) authorized under 23 U.S.C.134, 23 CFR 450 and Section 339.175, Florida Statutes. The Florida Department of Transportation is authorized to transmit to the MPO its proportionate share of PL Funds approved by the FHWA. Funds are authorized on an annual basis. The Supervisor of Elections has been reserving funds to procure voting equipment as well as upgrade and replace current voting equipment. An upgrade to DS200 modems is required because Verizon will no longer support 3G technology after 2019. Modems are used to transmit election night results from each precinct to the Election Center to facilitate the reporting of timely results to the Division of Elections, the public and the media.

15. <u>PERMISSION TO AMEND THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION MAINTENANCE</u> <u>MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENTS FOR THE STUART AND JENSEN BEACH CAUSEWAYS AND</u> <u>ADOPT ACCOMPANYING RESOLUTIONS</u>

In 2004, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) entered into a Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement (MMOA) for the spoil islands under the Jensen Beach Causeway. In 2006, with the completion of the Ernest Lyons Bridge, a similar MMOA was drafted for the spoil islands under the Stuart Causeway. These agreements addressed the maintenance of landscaping, hardscape and irrigation. The islands serve as park and recreation areas for residents.

Following Tropical Storm Sandy, the County wrote to FDOT District Secretary Wolfe (November 5, 2013) and requested FDOT's assistance in repairing the damage to the shorelines of the spoil islands under the causeways. Secretary Wolfe responded on December 2, 2013 denying the request and wrote that the spoil islands were "not components of the existing bridges" and that it was never the Department's intention to accept responsibility for the maintenance and repair of the shorelines. Martin County sustained the cost of the repairs.

The spoil island shorelines were again damaged during Hurricane Irma and a project was created and submitted to FEMA to address the repairs. FEMA denied the project claim on the basis that Martin County did not own the islands and had no "legal responsibility".

Staff is appealing the denial and, in order to eliminate the issue of legal responsibility in the future, has requested that FDOT amend the original agreement to include maintenance of the spoil islands and the shorelines. FDOT agreed to the request.

- **Benefits to Martin County:** Allows the county to apply for and receive federal and state funds for storm damages to the spoil islands.
- <u>Cost to Martin County:</u> There is no additional cost to Martin County, which is already maintaining the spoil islands.
