- C. Chief Schobel There has been a significant increase in calls with the assisted living facilities in the county; we definitely have an uprise/increase in ALS & 911 calls.
- **D.** All County Ambulance Service, poised the question, are they offering service in St. Lucie County also? They have their main building in Fort Pierce. Mr. Rego answered also that when they come into Martin County they will have a main building in Martin County with initially 4 rescues.
- E. Chief Harshburger pursued the idea of educating the public, nursing staff in local nursing homes and ALFs. Initially calls decreased but after time increased again. FR would respond and, if appropriate, could wait 45 minutes for commercial transport. Significant wait times to receive a patient in transporting. Wait times are getting worse. Discussion on what the wait times really are.
- F. Brett Clarke; we have a serious need for commercial service and the service brings assistance to the County where there is a need.
