GRANT ITEMS – PERMISSION TO APPLY

1. <u>PERMISSION TO APPLY FOR THE FLORIDA RECREATION DEVELOPMENT AND ASSISTANCE</u> <u>PROGRAM (FRDAP) FOR CHARLIE LEIGHTON PARK</u>

- <u>**Requestor**</u> Office of Community Development
- Granting Agency Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- <u>Project Description</u> FRDAP is a competitive program which provides grants for development of land for public outdoor recreation use or to construct or renovate recreational trails and park amenities. Martin County is seeking to conduct several improvements at this popular park. This is a small grant request for funding improvements included in the Charlie Leighton Park Master Plan which include: renovating the entrance landscaping, installing new landscaping including shade trees within the parks open space, and a new picnic pavilion.
- Requested Grant Award \$50,000
- Budgetary Impact none
- <u>Annual Operating Cost</u> Staff time for grant administration.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION:

- <u>Programmatic Implication if not approved</u> If not approved, less funds will be available to implement plans for renovations at Charlie Leighton Park as identified in the Capital Improvement Plan and Park Concept Plan.
- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> lower future revenue collection of Charlie Leighton Park by not having the new additional proposed park amenities.

- <u>Agreement/Contract drafted by</u> Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services – Division of Agricultural Environmental Services
- <u>Parties to the Agreement/Contract</u> Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and Martin County Board of County Commissioners.
- <u>Purpose of the Agreement/Contract</u> To provide state funding in the amount of \$41,645.44 to the Public Works Department's Mosquito Control Division for the purchase of chemicals used for arthropod control.

- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u> Enables the Mosquito Control Division to purchase chemicals used for arthropod control.
- <u>Cost to Martin County</u> The agreement requires matching with local funds of 25%, in the amount of \$10,411.36, which will come from the Division's operating budget. Staff time for grant administration.

- **Financial Fiscal impact if not approved** Additional Ad Valorem funds may be needed to purchase chemicals.

- **Duration**: June 14, 2019 through December 31, 2020.
- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u> Enables the Supervisor of Elections to improve the administration of federal elections in one or more of the following categories: voter education, poll worker training, standardizing election results reporting, or other federal election administrative activities.
- <u>Cost to Martin County</u> \$2,784.76 grant match already allocated in the Supervisor of Elections FY20 budget. Staff time to administer the grant.

- <u>Financial Fiscal impact if not approved</u> the Supervisor of Elections will not receive \$18,565.07 from the Florida Division of Elections.

- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u> This is a contribution of substantial funding to a planned special assessment project.

- <u>Parties to the Agreement/Contract:</u> State of Florida Division of Emergency Management and the Martin County Board of County Commissioners.
- <u>Purpose of the Agreement/Contract</u>: Funding in the amount of \$71,500 for the portable radios for the Mutual Aid Radio Cache (MARC) unit.
- New/Renewal/Modified: This is a new contract.
- **<u>Duration</u>**: Date of execution through August 30, 2020.
- <u>Benefits to Martin County</u>: Grant award of \$71,500 to enable the County to purchase multi-band portable radios for emergency response. Most importantly, this grant provides for program needs to ensure the safety and protection of residents.
- <u>Cost to Martin County</u>: Staff time for grant administration. There is no County funding match required.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION:

- Programmatic Implication if not approved Since 2005, the MARC unit has provided for emergency communications for Martin County and our first responder partners. The initial radio cache procured with the MARC unit is no longer supported. Should the grant not be approved, there would be significant impact on the operational readiness of the MARC unit for emergency situations.
- Financial Fiscal Impact if not approved-Funds would not be available for this program.
