Artist Statement

All public art is of interest to me, because public art enriches all our lives!

This project is of particular interest because of many reasons, one of which is that it calls for an interactive, colorful and whimsical piece, and I have developed something that fits that description perfectly! Almost as if it was already custom tailored and site specific for this venue.

Secondly, anytime there is an opportunity for art to be included in a library setting, I am thrilled! Art and education go so well together. I think it has to do with the celebration of culture, whether it be the visual arts or written word. For me, to have a sculpture placed around a library is such a high honor and worth every effort to achieve.

I also get the warm fuzzies when I think of the families of children and adults alike enjoying the interactivity of my Magnify sculptures together. They spin, swivel, cast stained-glass looking reflections onto the ground, and are sturdy enough to be handled daily with little to no maintenance. In fact, the core design was originally created for a climbing wall while I was working at ClimbZone, a New Zealand based, active family entertainment company specializing in themed climbing walls and franchised gyms.

Lastly, I have yet to build this sculpture because of the large expense it will take to rent time on the CNC machine, purchase the costly sheet of ½ thick clear acrylic and have it cut in a circle, the MDO board, the metal posts, etc. I am not in a position, yet, to spend thousands of dollars on research and development. Instead, I pitch this concept to potential RFP's and RFQ's like this one, in hopes that someone will choose it for construction. I have however built something smaller and similar, and experimented with printing on clear acrylic using a large format flatbed printer, (8' x 10' large). It works well, which makes me confident in proposing this as a viable sculpture potential.

Magnify is a built-in educational piece as children can learn about light refraction, reflection, even the principles of motion, all while having fun! They instantly peak the viewers interest and draw people in like a magnet, a perfect fit for the grounds of a library. They will last the test of time with their posts embedded 5 feet below ground level and come with a full replacement warranty against material failure or vandalism, which I do not expect but will plan for in the budget non the less.

Speaking of budget, if chosen, I will present a calculated and itemized budget breakdown of all costs associated with this project to the committee. Although I no longer work full time as Lead Designer at ClimbZone Production, I still use them as my top fabricating resource.

Peter & Julie Cummings Library Public Sculpture Proposal

Artist:

Kirk Seese

Materials:

Post:

10' long, (5' from ground level) x 2" square tubular steel, primed & painted

Base: 8" diameter x 5' deep concrete footer

Rings:

30" diameter half circle x 3/4" thick Medium Density Overlay Board, (MDO), CNC cut, primed, routed, sanded & painted gloss black

Lens: 1/2" thick clear acrylic with designs directly printed onto the surface

Paint: Exterior Black Laquer

Protective Coating: Clear, UV inhibiting, self leveling epoxy resin (Tarbender)

Pins: Stainless steel swivel carriage bolts or something comparable.

Process:

Assemble the rings and lens set

Attach rings and lens set to post

Cover in bubble wrap and prepare for shipping.

Dig hole on site using auger, insert post, level & pour concretee.

Price:

\$2,500 for a one - two year loan, \$7,500 to purchase

Introduction

This interactive, kinetic sculpture acts as a giant magnifying glass, except sunbeams pour through the colored "lens" as the viewer swivels the rings into position to catch the light, casting a stained glass reflection on the ground, or anything else it hits.

Made from CNC cut, sign industry standard MDO board, primed and painted black, a steel post, and a 1/2" thick piece of circular, clear acrylic with designs directly printed on using UV Ink from a large format flatbed printer, this piece is meant to be enjoyed outdoors by the general public.

The entire sculpture can be secured to a concrete pad using a welded base plate, or embedded in the ground using a concrete footer. The image below reflects the concrete footer method.

Magnify instantly becomes an education tool as it demonstrates the concepts of transparency, light reflection and refraction, even the physics of mobility with it's rotating top.

It immediately draws the viewers attention begging to be touched and handled. A strong addition to any temporary or permanent sculpture collection!

In conclusion, Magnify is an invitation to explore, play and have fun. It invites the curious, inspires the creative, and adds wonder to the everyday domesticity of life. Imagine passing this piece by a park, sidewalk, or city street. If seeing it for the first time, you are going to check it out. You will investigate. It's inevitable. Does it move? Can I spin it? What's it made out of? Who put it here? All those questions and more spring to mind and are welcome.

In this serious and sometimes frightening world we live in, I am drawn to the clever street art I see all over Instagram, the meme's on Facebook that make me chuckle, and the playfulness of work like this, to balance all the dysfunction out there. It's a reminder of how we are all made to create, to produce beautiful things, together.

That there is commonality in all of us, and the world is indeed a wonderous and special place.









The only reason I have not built this yet is because of the high expense, including renting the CNC machine, purchasing a large piece of acrylic to cut the circle out of, the MDO and metal, etc.

I am hoping that a public sculpure commission will give me a reason to build it, and the funding necessary to bring this concept to life.

For the budget allowed, \$30,000, I predict to offer five to seven Magnify pieces in any arrangement the committee chooses. We could group them together in threes, or create a parade along the walkway. I am open to a conversation about placement and other colored design options if necessary.
