PRESENTATIONS

Agenda Item: 20-0873, CRA Proposed Land Development Regulations, Article 12, Division VII Golden Gate

Dana Little, Urban Design Director, Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council, presented the proposed land development regulations for Golden Gate.

- S. Tsaftarides Board member read a Letter to the Editor excerpt from the January 1998 Newsletter "The Golden Gater", that she received from a 28-year resident. The letter expressed concern about noise, traffic, dogs barking, radios playing music loudly and laundry drying in the trees. The anonymous resident states that "they just want peace in their community". S. Tsaftarides goes on to say that there are 869 parcels, 203 are homestead. 666 are rentals. We are very congested. This is where most of our elderly residents live. Golden Gate Avenue east, Norman to the north and Kensington to the south, leave them out. They do not want any apartment buildings or multifamily in their areas.
- C. Winters You were at both Golden Gate meetings?
- S. Tsaftarides Yes and at the Golden Gate meetings, there were not many residents, two of the residents that were original weren't at the meeting, and the rest of them, one is a property owner, the other is a business owner and she has no idea what's going on and the third lives on St. Lucie Blvd. and she's not really involved.
- R. Kennedy Has there been a change to the permitted use of those properties?
- S. Tsaftarides People never got the chance to speak, they got the letter two days before the meeting.
- R. Kennedy But aren't the permitted uses the same as they were before?
- D. Little In that area, in 2003 it was decided that duplexes would no longer be permitted. The density of 8 units per acre never changed. The discussion was that the neighborhood didn't like duplexes. What is the change that you would like to make?
- S. Tsaftarides Golden Gate Avenue east, Norman to the north and Kensington to the south. They don't want to have any apartments next door to them, they want to stay the way they are.
- S. Kores Just to clarify, no residents received letters because none were sent for the NAC meetings.
 They are sent for the LPA and the BOCC. Can we take public comment if it's not actually from the public?
- E. Lenihan This Board has received public comment and you can take that as part of your decisionmaking process whether you move this process forward, move it forward with changes or send it back to the NAC.
- D. Little Ms. Lenihan, we received a unanimous recommendation to move forward from the NAC, if there is now a recommendation for change, do we go back to the NAC or move forward?
- E. Lenihan We would move forward.
- C. Winters So isn't this somewhat like Pt. Salerno when there were people that wanted some tweaking and then you met with them and we moved it forward?
- D. Little This is different. We had two full NAC meetings to discuss the LDRs and the committee voted unanimously to approve both times. We did not have any residents come forward.
- R. Kennedy What are the changes that you are looking for? Wasn't multifamily allowed before? Were these permitted uses there already, or has this increased?
- D. Little This is where it gets confusing and why we are updating the codes. The current code allows
 up to 8 units per acre and we are allowing as much flexibility as possible to not take away anyone's
 previous rights. When there is a conflict, we default to the FLU. The density allows 8 units per acre. We
 didn't even recommend apartments or townhouses, but the NAC directed us to add them. The focus was
 duplexes.
- C. Hall How much vacant inventory is left in Golden Gate?
- S. Tsaftarides There are 157 vacant lots.
- D. Little This will change when water and sewer go in.
- C. Winters Did you have a quorum at the NAC meetings where this passed two times and was the vote unanimous?
- S. Tsaftarides Yes.
- D. Little What is the objection? What is the change that you want to see made?
- S. Tsaftarides Around the strip of Golden Gate, we do not want the apartments.
- D. Little We are not recommending anything new in this area except at the recommendation of the Board, we are adding townhouses and apartments as building types.
- M. Banas There is is 8 units per acre.
- S. Tsaftarides Everything east of Golden Gate Ave, north of Norman and south of Kensington should not permit apartment buildings.
- D. Little Saadia is reporting community concerns that we haven't actually heard in a public meeting.

- J. Mills We held over 15 interviews with residents and businesses within Golden Gate and everyone supported the code changes.
- C. Hall No matter what, the 8 units per acre has not changed.
- D. Little This is exactly right, the intensity or density is not changing, only the form is changing.
- R. Kennedy These issues raised by the resident are code enforcement issues.
