Susan Kores, CRA Manager presented the project and the process performed by the subcommittee. Four artists responded and the PAAC has those submittals in their packages for review.

• C. Hall – For the benefit of the public, I would like to go through each project.

We will start with Jenn Garrett and her proposal is called "Literacy Looking Glass". Ms. Garrett has proposed two options to choose from for this project.

***artist Jenn Garrett joined the meeting via telephone conference

- C. Hall I would like to ask Jenn how many sets of these are in her proposal?
- J. Garrett For the first proposal, I would create two forms and for the second proposal, just the single stem with multiple books extending out with three reading stools as well.
- C. Winters Do you have a cost breakdown?
- J. Garrett Both of these proposals will be within the \$30,000 limit which includes installation, delivery, finishes, and documents involving the maintenance of these items.
- C. Winters Is the maintenance something you offer or do we have to provide?
- J. Garrett My pieces would be maintained by the same people who do you your general maintenance, not high level.
- S. Kores Just for your information, the contract comes with a general maintenance information sheet.
- J. Garrett I do work with an engineer and my work can withstand the weather in Florida. My engineer designed the base and steel in my structure as well.
- S. Kores What stained glass experience do you have?
- J. Garrett This will be my first stained glass project and I am working with an artist in Gainesville who has extensive experience in stained glass.
- S. Kores Susan read public comment sent in via email by Eric Buetens (attached)

The second artist is Nadia Utto and her project is called "A to Z".

***artist Nadia Utto is in attendance at the meeting today

- C. Hall Is the structure solid concrete? The smaller letters in the book, would they break?
- N. Utto Yes, it is solid concrete and there will be no maintenance involved. The letters will be connected with rebar and they would not break. I envision these letters to change and evolve over time. The kids could color, decoupage, encourage participation, taking selfies, playful and intellectual.
- C. Hall I have looked at this one guite a bit and I do like it.
- S. Tsaftarides It is a beautiful concept and I love it.
- C. Winters What kind of paint are you using?
- N. Utto I can use colorized concrete and it does not have to be painted. The interactions in the future will provide paint, decoupage, or any other medium the library allows.
- M. Palazzo How many letters are you including in this piece? What is the height of the letters?
- N. Utto All 26 plus a hashtag. 3 foot tall letters.
- J. Priest I would suggest that you space the letters so that the participants cannot jump from one structure to another. This will be a safety issue.
- S. Kores The committee's main issue with this submittal was safety concerns.
- S. Kores Susan read public comment sent in via email by Eric Buetens (attached)
- J. Salas The concern for these projects are the ADA requirements with the spaces as well as landscaping so please keep that in mind as you are going through these.
- M. Palazzo Is there something that we can consider here regarding ADA?
- E. Lenihan Concerning ADA, we have to make sure the sidewalks are clear and access to the pavilion and building is not blocked. I think yard maintenance would be a bigger concern.
- J. Salas Any of the outdoor spaces that are interactive have to be on concrete pads so that anyone with a disability will be able to access.

 S. Kores – The issue is that if the piece is interactive and invites the person to touch and play with it, there is some kind of ADA rule attached. We will meet with county ADA representative and get more information.

The third artist is Mohamed Chabarick and the project a single piece mosaic with two sides.

• S. Kores – Susan read public comment sent in via email by Eric Buetens (attached)

The fourth artist is Kirk Sees and the project is called "Magnify".

- S. Kores The committee had some concern on long term maintenance on the piece. The artist did talk about maintenance in his submission.
- S. Kores Susan read public comment sent in via email by Eric Buetens (attached)
- J. Cox Jana read public comment sent in via email by Nancy Turrell (attached)
- S. Tsaftarides We need to promote local artists. I suggest we contact a safety expert to help us with this project.
- M. Readling I like the interactive concept of Nadia's presentation, but I do like the Jenn Garrett option as well.
- S. Kores Can I make a recommendation as to how we move forward? We can make a motion to send our recommendation to the BOCC, we can direct staff to get more information, we can require staff to send questions to the artists to have them answered, it is up to you at this time.
- R. Kennedy I suggest we chose 3 and have them go back to the subcommittee. They have more knowledge than we do.

Readling motioned to send 3 of the submittals, Garrett, Utto and Sees back to staff and subcommittee asking the artist to revise their work and clarify the actual engineering design scope, provide a maintenance plan, provide an aerial site view of the piece and provide further ADA compliance considerations. I was on the Martin County Public Art Advisory committee in the early 2000s and we completed 13 public art projects during my tenure there so I do have some experience with the issues involved in your decision making and what some of the weak points of projects we choose have been.

My comment on the Garrett proposals is that I like the general concepts but do have a couple of concerns.

1. The proposal is literally sketchy and doesn't have the detail necessary to fully evaluate the aesthetics and durability of the designs, specifically what type of glass is proposed, what is support structure going to look like, what will the benches look like (in the reading nook design) and what are they composed of? Many details of the project are absent.

2. How is glass replaceable, as artist states? How fragile is the glass if hail is going to damage the glass?

My comment on the Seese proposal is that I like the general concept but do have a couple of concerns.

- 1. This is meant to be handled or touched and having the exterior black enamel paint in the hot Florida sun could be a safety issue.
- 2. I'm not sure how the printing on acrylic will hold up for more than a couple years in the hot Florida Sun.
- 3. What sort of lubrication or maintenance will be needed on the rotating points of the sculpture and how long can that be expected to hold up.
