AN ORDINANCE OF MARTIN COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 155, STREETS, ROADS AND BRIDGES, GENERAL ORDINANCES, MARTIN COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO SPEED LIMITS, DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY, REQUIRED PERMITS, AND SECURITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTING PROVISIONS, SEVERABILITY AND APPLICABILITY; PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND CODIFICATION.

This intent of this Ordinance is to: (i) acknowledge the reliance on the Florida Statutes as they relate to establishing speed limits on County roads; (ii) delegate certain signature authority to the County Engineer; (iii) require permits for County projects within the County right-of-way; and (iv) require security during the warranty period for permanent improvements within the County right-of-way.
