A Proclamation

Declaring Florida Redevelopment Week in Martin County, Florida

- Whereas,Community Redevelopment Agencies (CRAs) and redevelopment programs play a vital role in revitalizing neighborhoods, addressing areas of slum and blight, strengthening local economies, revitalizing downtowns and improving the quality of life for residents and businesses throughout the State of Florida; and
- Whereas,redemption programs authorized under Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, provide essential tools for local governments to address infrastructure deficiencies, promote economic development and support public improvements in designated areas of need; and
- Whereas,redemption initiatives encourage private investment, support small businesses, improve infrastructure, enhance public spaces and strengthen the character and vitality of communities; and
- Whereas,the Martin County Community Redevelopment Agency serves the communities of Golden Gate, Hobe Sound, Jensen Beach, Old Palm City, Port Salerno and Rio, working with residents, businesses and community partners to identify priorities and guide redevelopment investments that reflect the needs and character of each area; and
- Whereas,the Florida Redevelopment Association (FRA), in partnership with municipalities, counties, Community Redevelopment Agencies and community stakeholders, promotes best practices, professional education and collaboration to advance community redevelopment efforts throughout Florida; and
- Whereas,Florida Redevelopment Week serves as an opportunity to recognize redevelopment achievements, highlight transformational projects, engage residents and stakeholders, and celebrate the economic, social and community benefits of revitalization.

Now, therefore, be it proclaimed by the Martin County Board of County Commissioners that September 14-18, 2026, is Florida Redevelopment Week in Martin County, Florida. Further, the Board calls upon the people of Martin County to recognize and celebrate the contributions of community redevelopment programs and to participate in activities highlighting the importance of revitalization efforts across our communities.
